# **2020 School Field Trip Information**

In these field trips time has been allotted for a morning snack break held outdoors, or in poor weather on the screened porch of Mackie Lake House. Students could bring a pioneer-style snack — a boiled egg, cucumber or cheese sandwich, apple or a cookie. We are environmentally conscious and desire that no footprint is left behind so all garbage must be taken away with you.

The bus drop off is at the end of the driveway and any other vehicles are invited to park in designated parking areas. Students will walk down the driveway from Kidston Road and assemble in the circular driveway in front of the House.

Students should dress appropriately for being outdoors. When coming into the house be aware that students need to remove their shoes and use the footwear provided.

To keep in the spirit of a Heritage visit we ask that students do not bring cell phones or digital cameras, pencils and notebooks are welcome.

**Time Options:** If you have special time constraints please advise us when you register.

Field Trip I 8:30 am (or school start) to 11:30 am

This option only allows for a house tour and an experience in Fylton Forest with a 15 minute snack break. **Field Trip II** 8:30 am (or school start) to 2:30 pm

This option allows for a house tour, an experience in Fylton Forest, and a teacher planned activity such as: creating artwork, writing, reflection or active movement/traditional games, or perhaps a visit to nearby Bishop Bird Sanctuary, and time for lunch on the grounds.

For the field trip the class will be separated into two groups which will switch places half way through the field trip so each group will have both experiences.

#### The House Tour:

Students will be toured through this historic 1910 House beginning outside under the maple tree with an observation of the exterior architecture of the house. A guide will provide a brief history of immigrants to the valley, comparisons of a child's life from the early 1900s until present day; the ways in which immigrants brought their cultures and traditions to the new world, artifacts from the past and the stories of the families who lived in the house. Learn about the art (paintings, photography and pottery), architecture and characteristics of this unique home.

#### **Fylton Forest** and the Joan Heriot Centre for Environmental Studies:

We invite students to share in the excitement of the study of the flora and fauna in this semi-arid climatic zone. Resources in the outdoor classroom include: tools such as microscopes, magnifiers, specimens such as bones, feathers, nests and insects; a resource library. Students can investigate a system of trails through grasses and native trees and shrubs. A guide is in attendance to provide direction and assistance. Visitors are asked to NOT pick flowers or remove anything from the property without permission.
